



2014/15 Chamber Highlights

- Actively working with the Butte Local Development Corporation and Butte-Silver Bow to attract and bring new businesses.
- Hosted hospitality rooms and support at tournaments in conjunction with Advantage Butte, the Butte Civic Center and the Maroon Activity Center.
- Involved in the recruiting efforts with St. James Healthcare to assist in bringing new physicians and health care specialists to Butte.
- Co-hosted 12 Chamber Business Card Socials with Chamber member businesses and organizations
- Celebrated ribbon cutting ceremonies with new or remodeled Butte businesses
- Co-hosted Montana Tech tail-gate parties
- Provided over 500 new-student welcome packets to incoming Montana Tech students and provided a welcome BBQ to the students and their families.
- Provided historic trolley tours to 4581 passengers

Beautify Butte

• Each year concerned citizens of Butte and Anaconda meet at the Butte-Silver Bow Chamber of Commerce to plan a strategy to clean up our communities. Janel Madrazo has graciously volunteered to chair this year's campaign.

Topics that were discussed at this year's meeting were media coverage, Adopt-a-Lot, recycling, Mainstreet activities, Alley Rally, NCAT "E-Waste" Days and neighborhood/organization clean-ups. Great input from all attendees at the meeting set a solid foundation for this year's campaign.

The Butte-Silver Bow Urban Forest Board and the Montana State University Extension Office developed a tree planting guide to assist residents in the selection and planting of trees in our climate. Included in the guide is a voucher worth \$50 toward the purchase of a tree suitable for planting in a boulevard or visible front yard location. For further information regarding the tree planting

Business Developement/Retail Breakfast Meeting

• The Butte-Silver Bow Chamber of Commerce, in partnership with Butte Local Development, Butte-Silver Bow, Headwaters RC&D and Mainstreet Uptown Butte, has been diligently working on retail in our community. During the course of the last year, we have held five Retail Breakfast meetings at the Butte Civic Center with about 50-100 people in attendance. Two surveys, one for retailers and another for customers were conducted, with the results shared at the retail breakfast meetings. Items to be addressed include customer service and larger selections on merchandise. The most recent meeting focused on getting to know your customer base.

Customer Service Training

• The Butte-Silver Bow Chamber of Commerce hosted Bill Drury's "Team 2.0" seminars on May 7, 2014. Over the last 10 years, 400 of the Fortune 500 companies have sent attendees through the lively half-day customer service workshops. Attendees from businesses, both large and small, gave rave reviews and the feedback has been fantastic.

All-Star Classic

• The Butte-Silver Bow Chamber of Commerce hosted the 5th annual "Southwest Montana All-Star Classic" at the Montana Tech HPER Complex March 18. The HPER was filled to capacity. The boys and girls treated the fans in attendance to a thrilling evening of basketball excitement. The proceeds from this game help to defray expenses of all of the hospitality rooms for all tournaments that Butte receives during the course of the year. On behalf of the Butte Chamber of Commerce, we would like to thank Don Peoples Jr. for bringing the idea of this classic to the Chamber and helping us to recognize the outstanding basketball players from Southwest Montana.

In addition to great basketball games, the Butte High School and Butte Central High School cheer squads led the cheers. The Butte High School Band, Anaconda High School Band, and the Anaconda Drum Line provided musical entertainment during the evening. The national award-winning Dynamic Dance and Tumbling Academy provided two superb halftime performances. Whenever our community comes together in this manner, it is a win-win for everyone involved.



Friends and neighbors in Butte and southwest Montana,

The Butte Local Development Corporation is once again partnering with the Butte Chamber of Commerce and the Butte Local Government to provide this Annual Community Report to our local citizens and others in southwest Montana. This past year has seen quite a bit of activity in various areas of economic development throughout Butte. The BLDC continues its close working relationship with the Chamber and local government which has proven to be successful for our community. We hope that you find the information in this report informative and educational.

Butte's population grew again in 2014 – the 8th consecutive year of growth, which is the longest consecutive growth period prior to 1920. Our current average annual labor force is 17,016. Our per capita income continues to grow. It is ranked IOth highest (\$45,047) in the state and highest among the most populace counties.

The BLDC worked on a large variety of projects during 2014.

- Finalized the financing of the Community Fiber Optic Network, which enabled it to become operational in July
- Established the Butte Economic Development Coordinating Council to work on a collaborative and coordinated marketing effort for Butte
- Helped re-establish the Major Employers Group to identify, discuss, and take action on issues affecting their business and our community
- Assisted in financing the new ownership of Millers Boots and Shoes that helped save one of Butte oldest and most recognized businesses
- Sponsored the second annual Community Excellence Awards to recognize business and individuals that "go the extra mile" for our community
- Provided contract solicitations from federal and state agencies to local businesses that resulted in approximately \$800,000 in additional work
- Provided administrative leadership for EDA grant that established the Montana Manufacturing Innovation Center which is incubating seven (7) new manufacturing companies
- Relocated BLDC offices to the Thornton building. New offices are in the same building as Headwaters RC&D, which will provide better service for clients requesting or requiring assistance. This is the first step in establishing a "One Stop Economic Development Center" in Butte
- BLDC funds lent out to local businesses \$381,050 which leveraged \$604,426 of commercial financing

2015 should prove to be a big year for construction in Butte. Several large projects will begin construction this spring-Butte-Silver Bow Basin Reservoir Water Treatment Plant, Metro Sewer upgrade, Montana Tech Natural Resources Research Center, Renovation of Comfort Inn, Buffalo Wild Wings and Hardees along with additional retail and commercial construction projects. The total of these projects should be about \$75 million, which will have a major impact on our local economy.













ANNUAL AVERAGE LABOR FORCE – SOUTHWEST MT





EARNINGS AND INCOME – SILVER BOW COUNTY

In 1943, the Montana School of Mines experienced a great impact from World War II when it officially became a Naval College. Ramsay School

Ramsay School serves kindergarten through eighth-grade students. Ramsay is located 10 miles west of Butte on I-90. The school district includes Fairmont, Dawson, Rocker, Beef Trail, Silver Bow and Buxton areas.

Ramsay is an RTI school and also has a Special Education Program. In conjunction with Butte School District #1, it offers special education support services to those identified students. There are 11 teachers, and the student teacher ratio is about 13-1. The school also has a counselor and a CSCT program contracted by ACADIA. Hot lunch and breakfast program are available. There are three bus routes, with monitors on all buses. Ramsay School has 35 employees, classified and certified.

Several special activities in conjunction with the regular and technology curriculum are offered. These include a swimming program for grades k-8 in the fall for 8 weeks through the YMCA, a skiing program with Discovery Basin for grades 1-8 and an Archery Program for grades 5-8. They also compete in the Anaconda competition. Seventh and eighth grade students also participate in a bowling program for 4 weeks. Students in grades 5-8 participate in a school Science Fair and also compete in the Regional Science Fair at Montana Tech.

In Ramsay's 7th and 8th grade curriculum, the students are taught shop, consumer education, drafting and keyboarding. Seventhand eighth-graders also participate in the Clark Fork Restoration and Watershed Program, kindergarten and eighth-grade graduation ceremonies, Career Day, and participate in a JOBS program daily.

Both of the schools, the Elementary and 7/8 have never missed achieving AYP from the NCLB regulations. Ramsay School has a quarterly Honor Roll and BUG program and also has a LIFE LONG LEARNER award given to an eighth grader annually.

Ramsay School has a several traditional activities, including an annual Christmas Play, Mother's Day Tea, Eighth Grade annual field trip to yellowstone park, class field trips and Student of the Week. Grades five through eight also participate in sports programs for volleyball, basketball, and track, competing with Butte area schools.



Cancer Center: With advanced diagnostic cancer services in both radiation and medical oncology, our Cancer Center provides high-quality and compassionate care to patients. In 2014, a three-phase cancer center construction project began. The first phase, constructing a new radiation oncology treatment area with a new linear accelerator, resulted in a reinvestment back into Butte of over \$5 million

Cardiology: Our Cardiovascular team provides patients with the highest level of cardiac care. Using state-of-the-art equipment, St. James provides both diagnostic and interventional cardiology services including cardiac catheterizations, angioplasty, coronary stenting and all cardiac diagnostic tests. St. James also offers a nationally certified cardiac rehabilitation and medical exercise program so patients can recover and receive follow-up care close to home.

Orthopedics: Our Orthopedic Center is a collaborative effort between St. James Healthcare and Montana Orthopedics. The Center offers quality, innovative, patient-focused services for trauma, joint replacement, and spine surgeries as well as sports medicine services. Our highly skilled orthopedic surgeons perform total joint replacement of the knee, hip and shoulder and prevention and treatment of athletic injuries, arthroscopic surgery and physical

therapy. Spine surgery includes complex trauma, scoliosis, pediatric and degenerative deformities, revision procedures, motion sparing technologies and cervical reconstructive surgery.

Surgical Services: In addition to orthopedic surgery, St. James offers general, vascular, thoracic (chest), and urologic surgery in four, state-of-the-art surgical suites. Our skilled team of surgeons has expertise in performing abdominal, lung, chest surgeries, including aneurysms, using the latest surgical technologies, such as the da Vinci Robotic Surgical System for minimally invasive surgeries.

Imaging and Ancillary Services: St. James' patient care is complemented by exceptional imaging and ancillary centers. The imaging center provides the full spectrum of diagnostic capabilities using the latest technology including a 64-slice CT scanner and an onsite radiologist for immediate needs, as well as an on-site CAP-accredited laboratory, anesthesia, pharmacy and therapy services.

Acadia Montana

is composed of Altacare, a school and community-based mental health services program contracting with over 160schools across Montana and a psychiatric residential treatment facility with 92 beds serving children and adolescents with behavioral, emotional and psychiatric issues. Each Altacare program employs a masters level therapist and mental health associate in each school. The facility in Butte employees 145 people and includes a child and adolescent psychiatrist, psychiatric nurse practitioners, a full time nursing staff, mental health, recreational and addiction therapists, teachers for the on-campus school and a full range of staff to meet the needs of their resident population.

Altacare works with elementary, middle and high school children throughout Montana; their residential center serves children and adolescent from throughout Montana and neighboring states. Altacare also has two Head Start programs.

The Butte Community Health Center (CHC)

has been serving southwest Montana since 1986. Healthcare is available for all people regardless of insurance status or their ability to pay. The CHC offers a sliding fee schedule that allows us to adjust charges for healthcare services according to family income. In addition, CHC accepts payment from Medicare, Medicaid, Healthy Montana Kids, and private health insurance plans. The CHC has locations in Butte, Dillon and Sheridan.

Services

Medical

The CHC provides comprehensive medical care, including physical exams and preventive care for all ages, urgent care, chronic disease management, substance abuse care, pediatrics and immunizations. We provide same day appointments for both urgent and routine care.

Dental

Our dental team works with patients to promote overall oral health, including check-ups, cleanings, x-rays, fillings and extractions. Each Wednesday morning we hold a walk-in clinic for dental emergencies. The second Friday of each month is Free Kids Day and all children are seen free of charge.

Behavioral Health

Their behavioral health therapists work hand in hand with the medical team to assess and treat patients.

Pharmacy

The CHC has a full-service retail pharmacy serving both CHC patients and the public. CHC patients are eligible for discounted medications based on income. Also, clinical pharmacists work directly with their medical providers to care for patients needing medication assistance and education inside the clinic.

Healthcare for the Homeless

CHC provides temporary medical services for homeless persons and ongoing medical care for people who remain in the Butte area. Case management is available to assist patients in finding local resources they may need.







Insurance Services Office (ISO) Public Protection Classification (PPC): 4/5-10 Career Department consists of 35 members who operate out of two Fire Stations.

Career Suppression Staff work a 24/72 hour schedule Career Suppression Staff is organized into four shifts - A, B, C, and D. Each Shift has a battalion chief, two captains and six firefighters

Career administrative staff consists of the Director of Fire Services, the Assistant Chief/Fire Marshal and a Fire Services Office Coordinator. The Fire Department operating budget also supports two 911 Emergency Dispatcher positions.

Volunteer Departments consist of nine individual departments, Big Butte, Boulevard, Centerville, Floral Park, Home Atherton, Little Basin Creek, Race Track, Rocker, and Terre Verde. Each of the nine volunteer fire departments has its own command structure and elected board of district trustees with the exception of Little Basin Creek which is categorized as a Volunteer Fire Company.

Volunteer staffing varies but typically runs in the range of 125 active volunteer firefighters.

The Fire Department budget supports 14 facilities which include the Silver Bow Fire Training Center and a fleet comprised of 32 pieces of fire apparatus and support vehicles.

Their Insurance Services Office (ISO) Public Protection Classification is a split classification- 4/5-10. Their most recent reviews and improvement of the Public Protection Classification was the result of a number of years of hard work and cooperation between a number of local government agencies.

Butte-Silver Bow Law Enforcement Department

The Butte-Silver Bow Law Enforcement Department is a professional police department and is the only law enforcement department serving Silver Bow County. The law enforcement department is led by an elected sheriff. The current sheriff is Ed Lester, a 26-year veteran of law enforcement in Butte-Silver Bow.

The law enforcement department also oversees the operation of the Butte-Silver Bow Emergency Dispatch Center and the Butte-Silver Bow Detention Center. The Law Enforcement Center is located at 225 N. Alaska Street in Butte. The detention center is located nearby, at 155 W. Quartz Street.

The mission of the Butte-Silver Bow Law Enforcement Department is to protect life and property from criminal activity and maintain the public peace and safety by enforcing the law. Activities of the law enforcement department include arresting and detaining suspects committing or attempting to commit criminal offenses, serving legal papers, suppressing breaches of the peace, riots, or insurrection, investigation of crimes, and administration of various community relations programs. The department recently received a grant from the federal government (COPS Program) to increase

transparency and enhance the relationship between the department and the entire community.

The law enforcement department currently has 51 sworn law enforcement officers, 11 dispatchers, 28 detention officers, and approximately 15 other civilian employees.

The Butte-Silver Bow Law Enforcement department responded to nearly 32,000 calls for service in 2014.

The law enforcement department is divided into three divisions: the patrol division, the investigative division, and the detention center. The department also has a Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team as well as a number of trained hostage negotiators. A canine unit was recently added to increase the drug enforcement capabilities of the department.

The men and women of the Butte-Silver Bow Law Enforcement Department are well trained professionals who are devoted to serving the citizens of Butte-Silver Bow.

dvantage Butte

Advantage Butte provides economic development for Butte through the sponsorship/underwriting of sporting events in the community. It is our plan to use \$19,000 provided by Butte Silver Bow to fund tournaments already committed to Butte for the fall of 2015 and spring of 2016. In 2014/2015, we used Economic Development Grant money to bring multiple districts, divisional and state basketball tournaments to Butte. This year's funding will allow us to assist with Western C Divisional Basketball tournament, the Western C Volleyball Tournament, State B Boys/Girls Basketball Tournament and the Western A Super Divisional Boys' and Western A Girls' Super Divisional Basketball tournaments. These events will kick off in November of 2015 and continue through the spring of 2016.

The easiest way to measure the success Advantage Butte has had is the **SCOPE** number of tournaments we have hosted. Since our organization began in 2004, through the spring of 2013 that number stands at over 115. The financial impact of these 115 tournaments is just over \$30 Million dollars added to our local economy. Advantage Butte plans to host 12 tournaments in 2015/2016.

Since Advantage Butte is a 100% volunteer organization, all money will go to the successful bidding and hosting of tournaments. Advantage Butte has always relied on donations from the Butte business community to create Economic Development.

The success of Advantage Butte has been noticed around the state with communities like Billings, Great Falls, Missoula and Bozeman/Belgrade all starting up organizations modeled after ours. The competition has never been greater and the spotlight on the positive economic impact a tournament has on communities is forcing us to all get more competitive and creative to keep or increase our share of the pie.

ECONOMIC IMPACT

The Montana Office of Tourism has established a straightforward formula to assist communities in measuring the economic impact that sporting events generate.

- Each team member is valued at \$100 per day. The average team is 18.
- Each team in the Class B and C bring 50 fans which are also valued at \$100 per day each. Class A and AA bring larger crowds depending on the event. For the Basketball Model we will use 75 fans.
- MTOT does not have a formula developed to value large tournaments such as track meets and wrestling. Therefore, we used one fan per athlete in the formula.
- Using this conservative economic formula, Advantage Butte has estimated the impact these tournaments will have on the Butte economy this year. The \$20,000 grant investment will multiply 62.5 times for a ROI \$1,250,000.





Butte-Silver Bow Convention & Visitors Bureau (CVB)

Montana lodging properties collect a 7 percent Accommodations or Bed Tax, with 3 percent of the collections going to the General Fund and 4 percent going to fund tourism promotion, primarily targeted at non-resident visitors at state, regional and local levels. Since Butte has a designated CVB, we receive a portion of these funds, somewhere in the neighborhood of \$80,000 annually (collections vary from year to year, the amount Butte receives varies accordingly). In April of every year a marketing plan/ budget is developed and submitted to the Governor's Tourism Advisory Council (TAC) for approval. The fiscal year for the CVB runs from July 1-June 30, with an annual audit of expenditures being completed by the Montana Office of Tourism (MTOT).

Given the small amount Butte receives in CVB funds, we are limited and creative with our projects.

Here is a brief overview of funding:

- · Director salary and Visitor Information Center staffing.
- Design and production of the Visitor Guide and Attraction Sheet/Map.
- Advertising in the tourism region travel planners Southwest Montana and Glacier Country.
- Placement of our Visitor Guides in racks on specific routes between Yellowstone and Glacier National Parks through Certified Folder Display.
- Postage, 800# and website hosting; enabling visitors to gain information on our area.
- Sponsorship to promote Montana Folk Festival, Evel Knievel Days and An Ri Ra.
- Billboard rental for a sign by Garrison, Montana.
- Co-op opportunity with the TBID and Forest Service to create some wonderful apps of our outdoor recreational opportunities.
- Representation at travel and tourism shows: American Bus Association, National Tour Association, Go West Summit, Rocky Mountain International Roundup and the Calgary Outdoor Adventure and Travel Show.



Butte-Silver Bow Tourism Business Improvement District (TBID)

The Butte-Silver Bow Tourism Business Improvement District (TBID) was formed in July 2011 at the request of hotel owners in Butte-Silver Bow (BSB). Hoteliers in BSB collect a \$1.00/room assessment per night. In 2014 the collection totaled \$220,403.

The goal of the TBID is to increase hotel occupancy through event promotion sponsorship, conference solicitation, and promotional campaigns targeting leisure market visitors. The TBID works with the Butte-Silver Bow Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB) and the Montana Office of Tourism (MTOT) cooperatively in marketing efforts, capitalizing on advertising buys in the presentation of a common message for our state and area.

Over the past few years the TBID has continued to give financial support to:

- Montana Folk Festival
- An Ri Ra
- Evel Knievel Days
- Basketball Tournaments
- Elite Pro Bull Riders
- Northern Rodeo Association

Several conventions held in Butte last year received some financial assistance from the TBID: Montana Association of Chamber Executives, Montana Parks & Recreation Association, Montana Newspaper Association and the Head-N-Tales Rally.

This spring the TBID, together with the meeting venues and hotel partners, will be rolling out a campaign highlighting Butte's traditional and unique conference facilities. Area Lakes and Rivers

The Big Hole River is the first choice of any Butte-area angler, with its wide variety of hatches and hungry trout. Just 30 minutes south of Butte on I-15, there is a chance at Rainbows, Browns, Cutthroat, Brook trout, Whitefish, and Fluvial Arctic Grayling. Summer fishing is highlighted with the start of salmon flies in the beginning of June, with Golden Stones quick to follow. Terrestrials are abundant throughout the summer and a great choice for top water action.

Nymphing can always be good with a variety of flies like pheasant tails, princes, stonefly nymphs, and caddis pupa. Keep your eyes open for a variety of mayfly and caddis hatches as well. Tricos and spruce moths are the highlight to the end of summer. The spruce moth can be imitated with a light-tan colored elk-hair caddis in a size #10, #12, or #14. The Big Hole can also produce a lot of fish on many different streamers. Sculpzilla, Buggers, Dungeons, Lil Kim, Butte Rats, and Skiddish Smolts are just a few great choices.

The "Spillway" can be an enjoyable fishery and it is only 20 minutes west of Butte on Interstate 90. This is the start of the Clark Fork River and is located right at the Warm Springs exit. The draw to the spillway is the chance to catch huge rainbows and browns. It is typical tailwater fishing here with small nymphs, such as pheasant tails, scuds, and midges. There is occasional top water action with

a variety of attractor patterns, and at the end of July it offers great hopper fishing.

Georgetown Lake is about 45 minutes west of Butte on I-90. The biggest hatch on the lake takes place around the Fourth of July when the damsel nymphs start to swim to the shore. Any damsel nymph can be fished with great success during this period. The damsel adult can be fished as well, doing best in the morning and evenings. The damsel is followed by a huge caddis that is a size #6 or #8. Fish a large Goddard caddis or attractor pattern well into the evening during this hatch. Skate them across the surface and hold on. Throughout the summer you can also try chronomids, leeches, and buggers. Rainbows are the primary fish caught, but there is a chance for brookies and browns.

Butte is the intersection to all of the best water you would ever want to fish in Southwest Montana. The Beaverhead, Madison, Jefferson, Missouri, Rock Creek, are a few more options that are super close to Butte. There are many more rivers, lakes, and small creeks that would keep you fishing for a lifetime.



Butte Area Trail Opportunities

Butte offers a variety of trail opportunities on Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management (BLM), City-County of Butte-Silver Bow and private lands. Many of these trails provide opportunities for panoramic views of the Butte valley and surrounding mountain ranges. Unique rock formations, abandoned railroads, old prospector and logging cabins and opportunities for viewing wildlife and plants make walking Butte's trails a fun experience for the entire family. The trails listed below are non-motorized trails open to hiking, mountain biking, and horseback riding.

Motorized trail opportunities are available in the Fleecer Mountain Range, Boulder River, and Whitetail-Pipestone area near Butte. The BLM has a trail map available for their ownership in the Pipestone area. The Beaverhead-Deerlodge Forest Visitor Travel Map provides information on trails and roads in the Fleecer, Boulder River, and Whitetail-Pipestone areas. Bear Gulch Trail #4108 and Herman Gulch Trail #4109 provide trail loop access into the Highland Mountain Range.

Trail Etiquette: To ensure everyone has a good experience on the trails practice trail etiquette: Mountain bicyclists should yield to hikers and horses. Hikers and mountain bicyclists should always yield to horses. Please move off the trail on the downhill side of the trail whenever possible and speak to the rider.

Remember to let someone know where you're going and take water, insect repellent, and proper clothing for changing weather conditions. All directions below are from Butte.

BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT Humbug Spires Trail – 3 miles

The trail follows Moose Creek up the drainage for about 1.5 miles then follows a small side drainage over a ridge and along the northeast fork of Moose Creek. Parts of this portion of the trail are fairly steep. After another 1.5 miles, you will find an abandoned miner's cabin at the head of the drainage. A large granite outcrop nicknamed the "Wedge" is about a hundred yards uphill from the cabin. The rock spires in the area are popular with rock climbers.

How to get there: Take Interstate 90 west to Interstate 15, take I-15 south toward Dillon approximately 26 miles to the Moose Creek Exit (Exit 99) and travel east on a gravel road for about 3 miles to the parking area for the Humbug Spires Wilderness Study Area. To reach the hiking trail, cross the foot bridge just downhill from the restroom.

FOREST SERVICE - BUTTE RANGER DISTRICT

Haystack Mountain – 3 miles

This trail is a moderate to difficult hike to the summit of Haystack Mountain, site of an old lookout. From the top you can have panoramic views of the Boulder and Elk Park valleys.

How to get there: Take Interstate 15 north toward Helena and exit at Elk Park. Turn right and then left (north) onto Frontage Road paralleling the interstate for approximately four miles, then take a right turn onto Forest Road #1538. Continue for approximately 1 mile to the end. There is a road on the right that continues to the trailhead. Visitors can drive up the road past the gate for another mile, however, the road is not suitable for two wheel passenger vehicles.

Thompson Park

Thompson Park is a 3,500 acre municipal recreation area located approximately 10 miles south of Butte on Montana Highway 2. The park is co-managed with the City-County of Butte-Silver Bow. The park offers 25 miles of non-motorized trails for hiking, mountain bicycling, cross country ski, snowshoe and horseback riding. There are two trailheads and four picnic areas that provides trail accesses including the historic Milwaukee Railroad (also known as the Milwaukee Road). The Milwaukee has two tunnels and a trestle that are the backbone of the trail system to access many of the trails in the park including the Continental Divide National Scenic Trail. You view a map of the area from the trailheads and picnic sites as well as obtain one from the Butte Ranger District office.

Popular trails in Thompson Park include the Milwaukee Road - 4.5 miles from Sagebrush Flats to Pipestone Pass, Beaver Ponds Trail - 3.5 miles from the trailhead to the CDNST, Blacktail Ridge Trail

4 miles that provides connections to the CDNST and west side of MT Highway 2; and Jon Gulch, Grading, Orman, and Crook Camp trails which provide loop trail opportunities west of the Milwaukee Railroad.

How to get there: Take Harrison Avenue to the MT Highway 2 junction and turn left onto the Highway. The Nine Mile Picnic area is 3 miles south at the junction of Continental Drive and MT Highway 2. The main entrance to the park is another 1 mile east as you drive into the canyon. The Eagles Nest Trailhead is the only facility that will accommodate trailers (horse and campers). Park maps are

available at the Butte Ranger District and Civic Center at 1340 Harrison Avenue.

East Ridge Foundation

Maud S Canyon Trail – 3.5 miles (loop and one-way) The trail is an easy walk of 2/3 mile to the railroad and is graveled. Cross the railroad tracks and continue hiking up the trail. The trail switchbacks up the hill for approximately 1.75 miles until you come to a "saddle". You can also hike to the east for approximately 1.75 miles to connect with the Continental Divide National Scenic Trail (CDNST). It is not uncommon to see moose and deer in the area; please keep pets under control. Total length round trip on is approximately

3.5 miles for the west loop and 5.25 miles for the out/back route to the CDNST.

How to get there: Take the Continental Drive Exit from I-90 (Exit 228). Turn north on the Frontage Road on the east side of the Interstate. Travel about .25 mile and watch for the trail head on the east side of the Frontage Road. Park in the parking lot and hike up the trail to the railroad grade. Continental Divide National Scenic Trail (CDNST).

The CDNST is a nonmotorized trail open to hiking, mountain bicycling, and horseback riding. The following are several trails segments close to Butte starting at Saratoga trailhead north of Butte and continuing south to the Fleecer Mountain Range.

Mountain Bicyclists need to practice trail etiquette at all times along the CDNST as there are many blind corners and areas where you may encounter horseback riders.

Thunderbolt Mountain to Konda Ranch

(Elk Park) - 36 miles

Beginning at Thunderbolt Mountain the CDNST winds through the forest to offer visitors glimpses of panoramic views of the Deerlodge and Boulder River Valleys. Most of the trail travels through the forest canopy crossing several forest development roads which makes it easy to hike shorter segments of the trail. Water is available along portions of the trail. There are four trailheads to access this section of trail. Three trailheads are accessed from Bernice: Saratoga Trailhead, Thunderbolt and Champion Pass. Konda Ranch Trailhead is located west of the Elk Park exit.

Saratoga/Thunderbolt/Champion Pass/Konda Ranch – How to get there: Take I-15 north toward Helena for approimately 25 miles. Take the Bernice exit and turn west onto Forest Road #82 for approximately 6miles to Forest road #1588, drive approximately 6 miles to the Saratoga Trailhead; to access Thunderbolt Trailhead continue driving .25 miles to Forest road #19720 and drive approximately 3 miles; to access Champion Pass continue on Forest road #82 for another 5 miles to Champion Pass. To access Konda Ranch take I-15 north 11 miles and take the Elk Park exit. Drive west approximately 2 miles to the trailhead. The trail takes off to the west on a road for 1 mile before entering onto a trail.

Nez Perce to Homestake Pass - 27 miles

Nez Perce trail #92 will take visitors from Elk Park to Homestake Pass for 13 miles to the Halfway Park road. Visitors will then travel on the Halway Park (FS road #8695) and Delmoe Lake (FS road #222) roads for approximately 14 miles to Homestake Pass. The trail winds through a lodgepole pine forest setting and is open to motorcycles. Halfway Park and Delmoe Road are forest development roads that are open to full-size traffic.

How to get there: Take I-15 north to Helena and take the Elk Park exit. Turn east off the ramp and south onto the Frontage Road for 0.15 miles. Turn left onto the Nez Perce road for approimately 4 miles to the trailhead.

Homestake to Maud S Canyon Trail/ Our Lady of the Rockies – 12 miles

This 12 mile segment of CDNST does not connect through, but trail users can connect to the Maud S Canyon trail for a great day trip. The trail winds through the forest giving visitors great views of mountain ranges and valleys to the east and west. Rock outcrops displaying boulder batholith, old cabins and cordwood piles gives visitors a glimpse of unique geology and Butte's rich mining history. The trail extends 3 miles north of the Maud S Canyon junction where you then need to turn back as the trail is not constructed beyond this point. A final trail connection to the Nez Perce trail will be completed in 2015. From the Maud Canyon junction you can travel 3.5 miles to the Maud S Canyon trailhead. From Homestake to Maud S Canyon trailhead it is a 13.5 mile hike.

How to get there: From Butte, take Interstate 90 east to Homestake exit. Turn left at the ramp head north for .5 miles to the Homestake trailhead. The trail begins on the north side of the railroad tracks

Homestake to Pipestone Pass – 9 miles

The trail begins at Homestake Pass and continues to Pipestone Pass 9 miles (one way) along the continental divide. Along the trail and at the highest point vistas of the Highland Mountains, Fleecer Mountain, East Ridge, and other mountain ranges make this trail a delight to hike or ride mountain bicycles.

Homestake Pass - How to get there: From Butte, take Interstate 90 east to Homestake exit. Turn right at the ramp and a parking area is located adjacent to the ramp.

Pipestone Pass - How to get there: Take Harrison Avenue south to Montana Highway 2 to Whitehall. Montana Highway 2 heads east and climbs the pass to Pipestone.

Pipestone Pass to Limekiln – 4 miles

Vistas of the Fleecer Mountain Range, Pioneers, and Mt. Haggin can be seen along the trail. This is a great trail to hike or ride mountain bicycles. Bicyclists looking for a challenging loop opportunity can ride the trail to connect with the Limekiln FS road #8492 turning north (right) to Roosevelt Drive, then right to MT. Highway 2; then right (heading east) to the top of Pipestone Pass. This loop is approximately 16 miles long.

How to get there: Take Harrison Avenue south to Montana Highway 2 to Whitehall. Montana Highway 2 heads east and climbs the pass to Pipestone. The trail begins at Pipestone Pass and winds south along the continental divide for four miles (one way) to the head of Limekiln Road (FS road #8492).

Limekiln to Highland Trailhead – 9 miles

Visitors on this segment of trail will travel along the ridge and forest areas to provide grand views of Red Mountain/Table/Mt. Evans. This segment is rockier than others, making this more a challenge for mountain bicyclists.

How to get there: Take Harrison Avenue south to Montana Highway 2. Turn right onto Roosevelt Drive for approximately 3 miles to FS road #8493-Limekiln Road. Drive approximately 3 miles to the top of the divide. Note: The last 1 mile is a steep rough road that may not be suitable for 2-wheel, low clearance, vehicles.

Highland Trailhead to Burton Park – 8 miles

This segment of CDNST will take you through a forested area with several small meadows that may provide opportunities to view elk and deer. The first 7 miles is non-motorized where it will meet the Bear Gulch trail for the last mile to the trailhead. Bear Gulch trail is open to motorized

How to get there: Take Harrison Avenue south to Montana Highway 2. Turn right onto Roosevelt Drive for approximately 15 miles. Turn right at the sign for Burton Park Trailhead and drive .5 miles to the trailhead.

Burton Park to Rocky Ridge – 7 miles

This segment of the CDNST travels on forest development roads, crossing I-15 before entering the Fleecer Mountain Range. As you leave the Highland Mountain range you will be able to see across the valley to Fleecer Mountain for the last leg of the CDNST on the Butte Ranger District.

Rocky Ridge to Hungry Hill - 15 miles

Most of this segment of trail is open to motorized uses except for the last 3 miles. As you travel this segment at mile marker 12 you will come to Burnt Mountain. The vista from Burnt Mountain provides great views of the Deer Lodge Valley. Most of the trail travels through forested areas and crosses two forest development roads.

How to get there: Take Interstate 90 west to Interstate 15, take I-15 south toward Dillon approximately 9 miles. Take the Feeley exit and drive 2 miles west on FS road #96 to the Rocky Ridge Trailhead. For visitors who only want to hike to Burnt Mountain a shorter route begins at Bull Ranch Trailhead. To get to Bull Ranch trailhead continue on FS road 96 past Rocky Ridgefor 6 miles and turn right onto FS road #8505 for 2 miles to the Bull Ranch Trailhead. Burnt Mountain is 5 miles from this trailhead.

Copperway Trails

The City-County of Butte-Silver Bow has several paved accessible trails that wind through Butte north of Interstate 90. Corridor trails include the BA&P, Ulrich-Schotte, MT Con, and Poore-Wild Memorial Trail. Many of these trails are on old railroad routes that will take you through historic uptown Butte to MT Tech. New trail have been completed to provide connections from the BA&P Railroad to the MT Con Mine and Granite Mine Memorial. See the Copperway Trails brochure for more information on the urban trail system.



Skiing/Snowboarding

When it comes to skiing in southwest Montana, the challenge is which set of skis will you strap on for the day: Cross country? Back country? Skinny skate skis? Downhill skis? Telemark skis? Alpine touring skis?

Southwest Montana offers a treasure-trove of skiing options. People lucky enough to live here go where the snow is good. One option is the Discovery Ski Area, west of Anaconda. A family-run area, it's known for it expansive variety of terrain — from beginner (toddlers can learn here) and intermediate to the hair-raising double-black diamond runs on the famous "Back Side." And when those ferocious storms blow through, making roads slick and visibility frighteningly poor, you can bet the next day, when the sun breaks out and all is right with the world, that the deep powder skiing will be unforgettable at Discovery. And because the mountain can accommodate a crowd, you'll likely have some runs all to yourself. www.skidiscovery.com

Further south from Butte is the Maverick Mountain area, located west of Dillon, http://skimaverick.com/

Like Discovery, it's a locally owned operation that caters to families as well as hardcore skiers. Maverick is located just off the Pioneer Mountain Scenic Byway in the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest. Set in the Pioneer Mountains, Maverick boasts exceptional skiing and unparalleled views. The terrain

accommodates novice and expert skiers in a relaxed environment. Both Discovery and Maverick can brag: No crowds. No attitude. Rarely are there lift lines. Wide open skiing.

Southwest Montana also features a host of cross -country ski

options, from the privately operated Homestake Lodge, located atop Homestake Pass http://www.homestakelodge.com/ to the Mount Haggin Nordic Ski Area, south of Anaconda and west of Butte, or the Moulton Trails just a few miles north of Butte. The Mile High Nordic Ski Education Foundation maintains the Mount Haggin and Moulton Trails visit http://milehighnordic.org/.

The Mount Haggin trails are located on Mill Creek Road (SH 274) 11 miles south of Highway 1, near Anaconda. At Mount Haggin, the foundation maintains approximately 20 km of groomed cross-country ski trails in cooperation with the Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks. Approximately 10 km are groomed for skate skiing, and 15 km are groomed for classic skiing. Ski trails can also be used as access to backcountry skiing along the Continental Divide.

The trail system is groomed once or twice per week by volunteers using snowmobiles and Yellowstone Track grooming equipment.

Please no pets on the trails here; visit the dog friendly trails at Homestake Lodge and Moulton.

Trails are also groomed at Moulton Reservoir north of Butte in cooperation with the U.S. Forest Service. The trails here are generally not groomed to the same standards as at Mount Haggin but there is excellent skiing and the trails are dog friendly.

For those who prefer to haul a backpack and put climbing skins on their telemark skis, the options for back country travel are endless in southwestern Montana, with so much public land available. However, be aware of avalanche danger and other hazards of back country exploration in winter.

A good place to get information for any outdoor adventures in southwestern Montana is the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest website at http://www.fs.usda.gov/bdnf.

The Butte 100

Starting in 2007 as a small group of mostly locals, the Butte 100 has seen substantial growth in its short history. The race has recently been recognized in nationwide publications as an ultimate test of mountain biking physical and mental aptitudes. A focus of the volunteer-staffed is continued improvement in racer experience each year. The Butte 100 is proud to be contributing to the growing awareness of Butte, Montana as a world-class recreation city.

Though this entire event is named the "Butte 100," it consists of three individual races; the 25-,50- and 100-mile, run in conjunction and support of the other; sharing portions of course, supplies, aid stations, and the start/finish area. The trails of the "toughest mountain bike race in the country" are staffed by the capable and tireless volunteers making up the Neon Army.

The 100-mile racers will endeavor to complete a full figure-8 course that includes pedaling the equivalent of climbing Mt. Rainier. Only the 100's will experience the desert riches awaiting them in the BLM's Pipestone area. As the 100's are hammering the top portion of the "figure-8," the 50-milers begin the daunting southern portion of the "8." The 100's return through the start/finish area before taking on the now warmed-up southern loop.

The 50-mile course (south loop) is known for the notorious 6-mile Basin Creek Climb that looms over all racers–50's and 100's alike–half-way through the loop. The first male and female in both

races to the top are rewarded with King & Queen of the Mountain honors. Those surviving this and the ensuing "8 Miles of Hell," are greeted

with a silky 35-mile stretch of single-track on the USFS maintained Continental Divide Trail–the jewel in the Butte 100's crown. A downhill finish reawakens racers from their trail trance and wills them across the finish line.

With recent permit approval with USFS and BLM, we are excited to announce the addition of a 25-mile race format to the 2015 Butte 100 Mountain Bike Race weekend. The course will take place on the North portion of the 100-mile course.

Waiting for you at the finish line is the coveted finisher's mug, along with plenty of pasta and drinks. We encourage everyone–racers, families, sponsors, and friends–to hang out, take in the bluegrass jams of our favorite Red Mountain Band, and exchange war-stories from the trail until the race's awards and raffle starting at 8:00 p.m.

The Butte 100 is incredibly proud to have developed one of the nation's best mountain bike race events, attracting the highest caliber of racers from across the country and Canada. More so, the race is just as proud of the positive effects the race has had on our home, including its contribution to conversations spotlighting Butte's abundant recreation opportunities.

Rock Climbing

Created by a geologic explosion that resulted in the Boulder Batholith, the upheaval created lots of exposed rocks, thus making for a wealth of good rock climbing in the Butte area.

A particular favorite is in the Whitetail recreation area, east of Butte. Take Interstate 90 east toward Whitehall, and exit at the Pipestone Exit. Turn left, go under the overpass, then turn left again and follow the dirt road for several miles. You'll climb into a flat area and come to a parking area called Four Corners, which is marked by two newer latrines. Keep driving, and turn right on Forest Road 8635, which will take you to the area's famous Spire Rock. You can see Spire Rock from Four Corners — just look to the northwest.

Spire Rock is a compilation of many different climbs ranging from 5.7 to 5.11 in difficulty, with a variety of multi-pitch and sport climbing routes available. The semi-arid almost desert-like area that surrounds Spire Rock could be compared to Moab, Utah — except the soil is cream-colored, not red. The area also plays host to a variety of other recreationalists — mountain bikers, four-wheelers, motorcyclists, hikers, rockhounds and horseback riders. So be ready to share the resource.

Twenty-six miles south of Butte on Interstate 15, take exit 99 and head east up Moose Creek to the Humbug Spires trailhead. Hike four miles in to where the Highland Mountains shelter about 50 quartz monzonite spires, some of which are 600 feet tall. Novices and experts alike will find the Spires a rock climbing playground for free climbing or gear-required ascents.

Of all the guidebooks available, "Butte's Climbing Guide" by the late Dwight Bishop, a noted climber and mountain biker from Butte, is one to have for rock climbers new to the area. It's available on amazon.com, but sometimes it'll show up in used book stores in Butte — if you're lucky.



Municipal Parks

Altogether, Butte-Silver Bow's park sites total more than 450 acres of developed and undeveloped park land that provide both active and passive recreation opportunities for residents of Butte-Silver Bow and the surrounding areas, supplemented by the incredible public lands and open spaces in the Butte-Silver Bow area.

There are nearly 30 parks and an extensive trail system in Butte-Silver Bow, including skating rinks; a skate park; tennis, basket-ball, and volleyball courts; an all-abilities accessible playground; and sports fields.

Butte-Silver Bow natural areas include Thompson Park, a 3,800-acre forested park south of Butte that is co-owned and co-managed by the U.S. Forest Service; Big Butte, which is 310 acres; Skyline Park, which is 60 acres; Basin Creek Reservoir, which is 42 acres; and Blacktail Creek, which is 10 acres.

Butte-Silver Bow organizes adult sports including softball and volleyball. Partnerships with local youth organizations provide recreation opportunities including little league, football, tennis, and soccer.

Thompson Park provides non-motorized trails for hiking, mountain biking, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, and horseback riding; picnic areas; and regulation disc golf course. Skyline Park provides a children's fishing pond, dog park, all-abilities accessible playground, walking trails, and a hang gliding landing site. Big Butte provides non-motorized trails for hiking and mountain biking.

Butte is home to two golf courses: Highland View municipal course and the Butte Country Club course.

As the name suggests, Highland View has a wonderful view of the Highland Mountains south of town. The regulation nine was built in 1939. It is a par 35 with two challenging par 3s, small greens that require accuracy, and different tees for the back nine. It takes about two hours to play even when it's busy. The par 3 course was built in 1980, and it has a full swing on every hole. The greens are excellent with a lot of character. It's great fun if you only have an hour for all members of the family and a nice walk in the park.

The course is host to three tournaments during the year, as well as a number of leagues. Highland View is located in Butte's Stodden Park. The park entrance is off of Dewey Boulevard on South Utah Avenue.

The Butte Country Club is a member-owned private country club that provides its members golf, racquetball, swimming, tennis, and fine dining opportunities. The golf course is an 18-hole, challenging par 70. The club also provides a driving range to master technique or warm up before a round. The Butte Country Club is located at 3400 Elizabeth Warren Ave.

Both of Butte's golf courses offer lessons.

The Summit Valley is home to three disc golf courses.

Sagebrush Flats, located in Thompson Park on the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest just south of Butte, is a hilly and wooded 18-hole technical course. The course has a combination of tone poles and home-made baskets. Enjoy a long and challenging course surrounded by unbeatable scenery.

Another disc golf course is located just west of the Natural Resources Building on the Montana Tech campus. The 18-hole disc golf course is located within Montana Tech's Whiskey Gulch Mountain Bike Skills Park. The course is open to the public, and Montana Tech's Folf Club hosts tournaments and competitions at the course.

Copper Mountain Park is also known for its 18-hole disc golf course, which follows the perimeter of the park and includes a putting green. Enjoy a round with great views of Butte and the 'M' hill, at a park that includes softball and baseball diamonds and public restrooms.

rban Bike Lanes

Beginning in summer 2015, Butte's streets will include more than 11 miles of bike lanes. These lanes will create the first phase of a green transportation and recreation network, connecting Uptown to the Flat. Butte-Silver Bow has developed an urban trail system within its parks as well as trails that connect to surrounding open spaces utilizing many of the Butte's railroad and stream corridors such as the Butte, Anaconda and Pacific Railroad (BA&P) corridor; Blacktail; and Silver Bow Creek Greenway Trails.

Evel Knievel Days

Butte proudly welcomes visitors to attend the world's only celebration of its kind to honor the legendary "King of the Stuntmen," Evel Knievel. Throughout the 1960's and 70's, the red-white-and-blue clad icon jumped his motorcycle, broke his bones and captured the world's attention like no one before.



Port of Montana 2015 Community Report

Located on the juncture of Interstates 15 and 90, and served by both the Union Pacific and Burlington Northern Sante Fe Railroads, the Port of Montana is ideally positioned for distribution throughout the region. The Port boasts 120,000 square feet of indoor dry storage (including the only Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ) General Purpose Warehouse within a 5 state radius), 55 acres of outside storage, a 320 car capacity auto transfer facility, 2 liquid and 2 dry bulk transfer stations, 5 docking areas, and 2 certified scales.

Throughout the year, the Port continued to provide significant services to local importers, allowing them to defer, or in some cases, eliminate custom duties all together through utilization of the Port's FTZ General Purpose Warehouse. These valuable services enable Butte industry to compete in world markets.


There was a significant increase in the volumes of automobiles and liquid bulk products handled at the Port during the year. Items distributed locally originated throughout the US and Canada and from as far away as China and Brazil. Local producers also utilized the Port to ship throughout the US and Canada as well as to France and Australia.

The Port is proud of its 30 year history and continues to focus on the facility including critical updates and maintenance projects. Among the investments to the Port's infrastructure during the year were considerable improvements to rail and switch infrastructure, dock and industrial heater replacements, and installation of a storm water control system. The Port also played a key role as a founding member of the Outback Rail Association, an organization of short line railroads and rail yards formed to promote rail safety.


